



Vaccination schedule for your new kitten:

6-8 weeks of age: Distemper combo

10-12 weeks of age: Distemper combo and 1st Feline

Leukemia

14-16 weeks of age: Distemper combo, 2nd Feline

Leukemia, Rabies

Distemper combo includes: Feline Rhinotracheitis, Panleukopenia, Distemper, Calicivirus and Chlamydia.

Yearly Vaccinations: Distemper and Feline Leukemia

Rabies is needed: at 4 months, 1 year later then every 2 years thereafter.

Deworming: All kittens should be dewormed, with 2 doses two weeks apart, after they arrive at their new home.

FIV/FeLV Testing: Talk to your doctor about if your cat should be tested.

Flea and Tick Prevention: We offer several products for your pet. Discuss with your doctor to see what is best for your pet.

Microchip Placement: Can be placed at 3-4 month vaccination visit or at the time of spay or neuter. This will help your pet get home from the clinic or shelter if lost.

Surgery

Declawing: Can be performed as early as 12 weeks of age.

Spay/Female: Can be performed at 5-6 months of age. Spaying your cat can prevent many health risks in the future.

Neuter/Male: Can be performed at 6 months of age. Neutering your cat can help with many unwanted behaviors, such as spraying and dominance.
